- 6. Story-/role-based learning through games
- 7. Add some physical exercise/ activates between the classes

'TOPS Convention', ended on positive and collaborative note with support of MBA@IICMR management, students and faculty members.











### **Level 3- PPT Presentation**


The students were asked to present their PPT in a brief format as well as identify the problem.




## Vertical no 2. Critique - Case study Competition




## Vertical 6. BULL, BEAR OR STAG

Inaugural session concluded with vote of thanks given by Mr. Maruti Prasad and announcement of further proceedings of UDAAN 2019.


#### 7.2 Valedictory Session


