### REPORT

**1. Title of the Activity:** Group Discussion - Professional Symposium

**2. Date & Venue:** 23 August 2024. MBA@IICMR had organized its second Employability Enhancement Programme (EEP) 2024 for Second year MBA Students.

**Time:** 9:30 a.m. – 12: 30 p.m.

### 3. Outcomes of Activity:

1. Students developed key skills in articulating their thoughts clearly and confidently during group discussions.
2. The session emphasized the importance of active listening, critical thinking, and respectful disagreement.
3. Participants learned strategies to effectively lead and contribute to group discussions, improving their overall employability.

### 4. Description of the Study:

The GD session was conducted by Ms. Moushami Achari, a seasoned corporate trainer with extensive experience in communication skills and soft skills development. The session focused on preparing students for the group discussion rounds commonly encountered during campus placements and corporate recruitment processes.

Key takeaways from the session included:

**Understanding the Dynamics of Group Discussions:** Ms. Achari explained the structure and objectives of a group discussion, highlighting how it is used by employers to assess a candidate's communication skills, teamwork, leadership, and ability to think critically under pressure.

**Effective Communication Strategies:** Students were taught how to present their points concisely and persuasively. The importance of clear articulation, maintaining eye contact,

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and using body language to convey confidence was stressed.

**Active Listening and Respectful Engagement:** The session emphasized the value of active listening and engaging respectfully with others' viewpoints. Ms. Achari provided tips on how to interject politely, build on others' ideas, and handle disagreements constructively. **Handling Challenging Situations:** Students learned how to navigate common challenges in group discussions, such as dominating participants, off-topic discussions, and time management. Techniques for steering the conversation back on track and ensuring equitable participation were discussed.

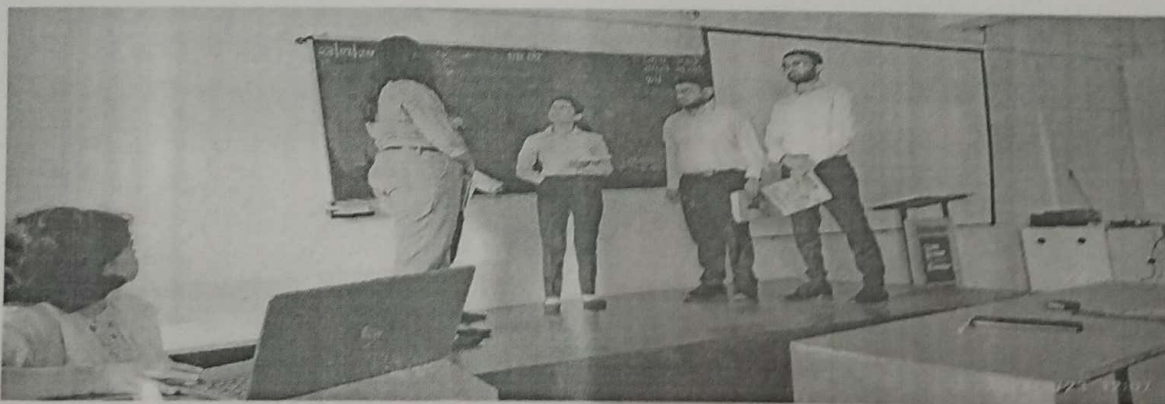
The session was highly interactive, with students participating in mock group discussions on various current topics. They received individualized feedback from Ms. Achari, who provided constructive criticism and suggestions for improvement.

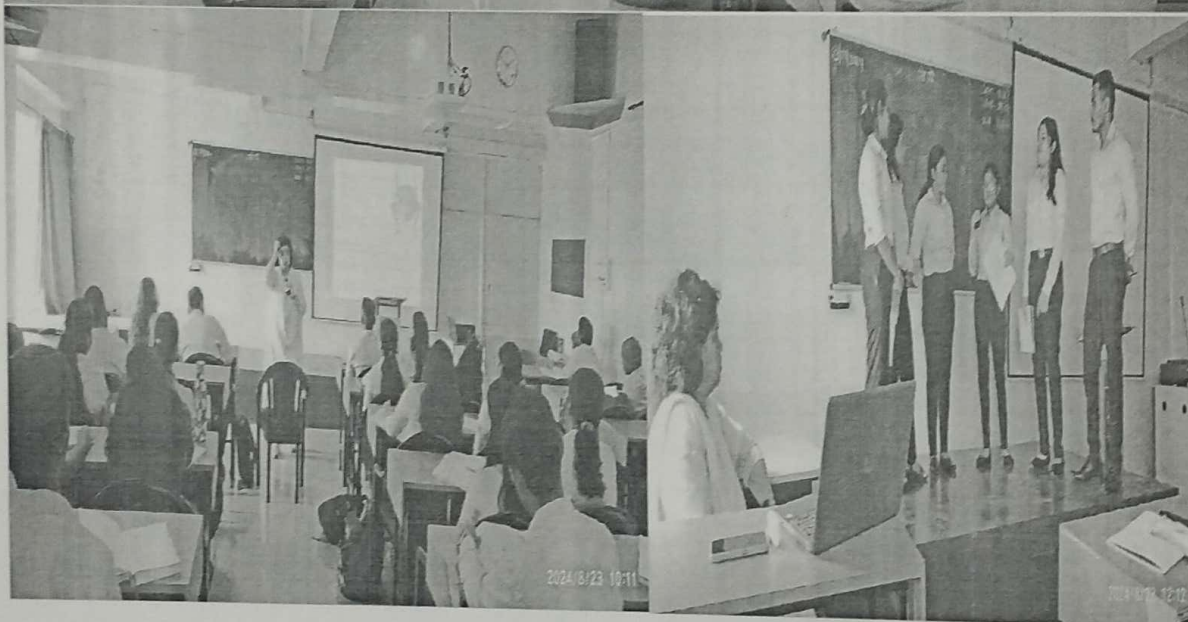
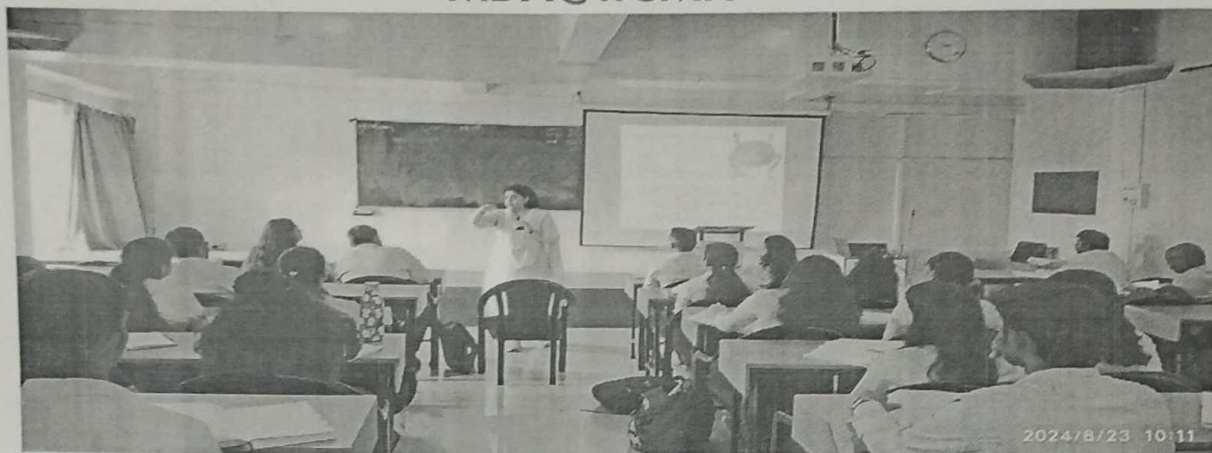
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
